OUR SPECTRUM

Amardeep Singh Shergill Memorial College, Mukandpur (SBS Nagar) was taken over by Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar on July 4th, 2007 as a University College with the mission to provide quality education to the rural youth. The university has established this institution as Rural Model College. Under the aegis of worthy Vice - Chancellor, Prof. (Dr.) Jaspal Singh Sandhu, our college is progressing by leaps and bounds. The college was established in 1994 in the memory of Amardeep Singh Shergill, an illustrious student of London School of Economics who passed away in the prime of his youth. He was the only son of S. Gurcharan Singh Shergill and Sardami Surinder Kaur Shergill. Instead of getting subdued in grief, the parents decided to serve a noble cause of spreading the light of knowledge amongst rural youth with the help of other 120 NRI associates.

The college is situated at Mukandpur, a small town in district S.B.S. Nagar. It is about 8 Kms from Banga, 20 Kms from Phagwara, 20 Kms from Phillaur and 20 Kms from SBS Nagar. The campus sprawls in an area of over 20 acres with an architecture that merges with the landscape. It has a splendid triple-storeyed building with an open shelf library, having more than 33,500 books, 40 journals/magazines and leading newspapers. The college library is also providing e-journals and e-books through NLIST, Directory of Open Access Journals (DOAJ) and National Digital Library of India. The library has a separate e-book section also. Students can also access educational C.Ds in the library. The college library provides facility of internet and photocopy to students and faculty members. The college has Physics, Chemistry, Botany, Zoology, Home Science, Music (V) labs and smart class rooms. In addition to this, there is a separate Computer Science and I.T. Block, which has six state-of-the-art Computer Labs equipped with 150 computers and internet connectivity of 25mbps (1:1) through radio link. The college campus is fully covered under Wi-Fi facility. Equipped with modern teaching aids, the Department of Commerce and Business Management disseminates essential skills of entrepreneurship through academic and professional courses. There is a separate Seminar

hall with a seating capacity of 170 persons. A hostel for 80 girls is available with extended internet facility in it. The Gymnasium with its latest imported machines is a cynosure of all eyes. Sports facilities include a track of four hundred metres and playfields for football, hockey, volleyball and handball. A fleet of buses carries the girl students to College and back to their homes. The beautiful open-air theatre helps our students to nurture their academic and cultural capabilities.

The college has highly qualified, hardworking and dedicated faculty. Presently, the college is running professional courses like MCA and MBA along with other traditional courses like M.Com, MA Punjabi, M.Sc.IT, BA, B.Sc, B.Com, BBA, BCA, PGDCA, DCA, DCM, DNCN and DMLT. The college is going to introduce PG Certificate course in TDS Management and Return Filing and Diploma in Food & Beverage from this academic session.

To widen the horizons of the learning, seminars and extension lectures by eminent speakers are arranged in the college from time to time. Separate units of N.S.S., Youth Club and faculty/subject wise societies have been working to make our students disciplined and service oriented citizens. Under the buddy programme for drug awareness being run by the Punjab Government, we are working towards educating our students about the ill effects of drug abuse and generate positive peer influence. Our College is leading in academics in the area and also has achieved name and fame in cultural activities. Educational trips are also organised during the session. Apart from being a medium for entertainment, these educational trips cultivate team spirit, mutual adjustment and tolerance amongst the youth. Various cultural programmes including talent hunt, inter-college competitions and Amardeep Mela are organized annually. Athletic meet is also our annual feature.

Our college has put forth an exemplary tradition of imparting blended education where students are given top priorities and teaching learning process is carried according to the need and pace of our dear students. Rules and Instructions Regarding Admission

- The application for admission will be accepted only in the prescribed admission form, available with prospectus from the college.
- The form should be filled in by the student himself/herself in legible writing.
- Incomplete application will not be accepted for admission.
- The student with compartment in 10+2 can be admitted provisionally in under graduation but he/she will have to clear the compartment by December, otherwise the admission will be cancelled.
- The student with compartment in graduation cannot be admitted in higher courses. If a student clears compartment within late fee dates then he/she can be admitted with late fee. Date of declaration of result will be considered valid not the date of issue of detail marks card.
- Student who has passed 10+2 from National Open School, New Delhi, and Punjab School Education Board Open School may be given admission in semester 1 of Under Graduation/ Diploma courses only on provisional basis. He/She will have to get equivalency certificate from GNDU.
- The student, whose result is declared late by the Board / University, can get admission within ten days (from date of declaration of result) without any late fee.
- Failed students from other institutions will not ordinarily be entertained in any course.
- College has right to correct the combination if a student chooses or is allotted a wrong subject combination by mistake.
- The age limit for students seeking admission in Ist semester of B.A. / B.Sc. / B.C.A. / B. Com. / B.B.A. / D.C.A. / D.C.M/ D.N.C.N./D. M. L.T./D.F.B. will be 20 years.
- In the absence of any rules by Board/University/Institution, the Principal has full decisive powers.
- For SC/ST students, relaxation of 5% marks in eligibility conditions shall be given as per rules.
- Student must have good moral character.

Important Note

- If any student overlooks above-mentioned instructions and tries to seek admission by giving false statement/document, then he/she will himself/herself be responsible for cancellation of his/her admission and forfeiture of his/her fee/funds.
- If number of admitted students in a class falls short of the minimum requirement set by the university, the admission made to that class shall be cancelled and the fee etc. deposited shall be refunded to the student in due course under university rules.
- The Principal has the discretion to permit or deny admission in any subject/subject combination/option/course in the college to any student.

Reservation Policy

Reservation of seats in a course shall be determined as per the Reservation Policy of the state of Punjab adopted by the University.

- (i) Applications under a reserved category must be accompanied by a certificate from the competent authority stating that the candidate belongs to that particular reserved category for which he/she is claiming a seat.
- (ii) All candidates must declare their claims for reserved categories at the time of filling their online

application.

- (iii) All admissions made in the reserved categories will be provisional and liable to cancellation if at any stage, any information about reserved categories furnished by the candidate is found to be fabricated or false.
- (iv) For SC/ST students, relaxation of 5% marks in eligibility conditions shall be given as per rules.

The reservation of seats in Departments where the number of seats are more than 30, the following categories will be clubbed. The seats will be allotted according to the order of merit.

- (a) Border Area/Rural Area (category iii) 2%
- (b) Children/Widows of Defense personnel/Para-Military Personnel (categories vii & viii) 2%
- (c) Children/Grand Children of Freedom Fighter, Terrorist Affected, Sikh Riot Affected (categories v, ix & x) 3%

Courses where the number of seats are less than or equal to 30

The reservations of seats in Departments where the number of seats are below 30, the following categories will be clubbed and the seats will be allotted according to the order of merit.

- (a) Border Area/Rural Area/Sports Person (categories iii & iv) 3%
- (b) Grand Children of Freedom Fighter/Children/Widows of Defense Personnel/Para-Military Forces Personnel/Terrorist Affected, Sikh Riot Affected (categories v, vii, viii, ix & x) 5%

The reserved categories (i) to (v) will be open for Punjab residence candidates only.

The total reservation of all categories (excluding the sponsored candidates) shall not exceed 50% (as per orders of Honorable Supreme Court) of the total strength in a course/class.

Rules Regarding Change of Subject/Course

- A student can change subject/subjects within 15 days from commencement of classes by filling prescribed proforma available in the office.
- Lectures in the subject would be counted from the start of the class, not from the date of changing the subject.
- A student cannot change subject/ course/faculty without approval of concerned head /incharge and Principal.
- A change in subject/ course/faculty must be intimated to the college office immediately.
- A student seeking change of course/ faculty will have to pay Rs. 1000.

University Ordinance of Carry on System for Various Semester Examinations

I. Courses having two semester duration:

- a) There shall be no condition for promoting a student from first semester to second semester.
- b) In case a student fails to pass all the courses/papers within a period of two semesters (One Year), he/she shall be given two consecutive semesters (One Year) more to pass.

II. Courses having four semester duration:

- a) There shall be no condition for promoting a student from first semester to second semester
- b) However the student shall be promoted to the third semester only if he/she has passed at least 50% courses/papers of the first two semesters.
- c) There shall be no condition for promoting a student from third semester to fourth semester.
- d) In case a student fails to pass all the courses/papers within a period of four semesters (Two Years), he/she shall be given four consecutive semesters (Two Years) more to pass.

III. Courses having six semester duration:

- a) There shall be no condition for promoting a student from first semester to second semester
- b) However, the student shall be promoted to the third semester only if he/she has passed atleast 50% courses/papers of the first two semesters.
- c) There shall be no condition for promoting a student from third semester to fourth semester.
- d) However a student shall be promoted to fifth semester only if he/she has passed atleast 50% courses/papers of the first four semesters.
- e) There shall be no condition for promoting a student from fifth semester to sixth semester. After a period of six semesters the student shall be given a period of two consecutive years to pass.

Quick and suitable action is taken against any complaint from a student thus ensuring a congenial environment in the college without any fear of harassment.

In order to boost the capacity to learn and to teach meaningful application to young minds the college makes best efforts to complement the academic system with practical skills through various teaching methodologies that extend beyond classroom. Varied and multifarious activities like field trips, educational trips, visit to companies and industries, hands on work experience in almost all the practical subjects are integrated to the academic agenda. Educational trips also cultivate team spirit, mutual adjustment and tolerance amongst the youth in addition to being the source of entertainment.

UNIVERSITY EXAMINATION RULES

- A student may not be permitted to appear in House Exams /University Exams if he/she fails to deposit fee in time.
- Every student must be present in all house examinations. Absent students will be penalized Rs.100/- per subject/paper, subject to maximum of Rs.500/-.
- Every student has to get at least 25% marks in aggregate in the House Exams.
- A student must attend at least 75% lectures in every subject.
- If a student does not fulfill the above criteria, he/she may not be allowed to appear in university examination.

CODE OF CONDUCT

The college prescribes an implicit code of conduct which every student entering its premises is expected to follow. Students should treat themselves to be the custodian of the college. Following rules should be observed:

- Students must be punctual in attending their classes.
- Roaming about or standing in the corridors during classes is not allowed except when change in class/period takes place. Movement from one classroom to another should be orderly.
- In vacant periods, students should go to the library, common room, prescribed places for boys and girls or canteen. They must not indulge in loud talk or gossip as it disturbs adjoining classes.

- Writing and sticking bills on the walls of college is prohibited.
- No outsider is permitted to meet the students without the permission of the principal.
- Mobile phones are not permitted in the college premises. Students will be fined in such cases.
- Any student found guilty of taking intoxicants/drugs in the college campus may be suspended immediately.
- Any damage to the college property will be severely penalized. Such students will not be allowed to continue their studies.
- Students who bring their vehicles with altered silencers that create noise pollution will be fined Rs.1000.
- Students are directed not to visit multipurpose hall and open air theatre in ordinary days. Any violator will be fined Rs. 500.
- Students are strictly prohibited to bring any kind of weapons in the college campus.
- Strict disciplinary action will be taken against careless and indisciplined students.
- Students must read instructions on the college notice board daily.
- Students must listen carefully to the instructions given during assembly and follow them earnestly.
- Routes of the buses will be decided by the college transport committee and students should follow the same.
- Routes of buses may be changed from time to time.

Prohibition, Prevention and Punishment for Ragging

Students are directed to desist any kind of ragging. Various forms of ragging include: Display of noisy, disorderly conduct, teasing, excitement by rough or rude treatment or handling, in-disciplined activities which cause or are likely to cause annoyance, undue hardship, physical or psychological harm or raise apprehensive fear in a fresher, asking the students to do any act or perform which such a student will not do in the ordinary course and which causes him/her shame or embarrassment or danger to his/her life etc.

- Withholding/withdrawing scholarship/fellowship and other benefits.
- Debarring from appearing in any test/examination or other educational process or withholding result.
- Rustication from the institution for period varying from six months to two years.
- Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution.

For special attention of parents/guardians

- It is the duty of the Parents/Guardians to visit the college office to get feedback of their wards.
- Contact college immediately whenever informed about any problem.
- Make sure that your ward attends all the classes regularly and take all the House Examinations /Class Tests.

Leave Rules

- Leave should be applied by the student personally or by the parents/guardian on the prescribed form available in the office with the required documents.
- In case of serious illness the leave application must be submitted as soon as possible along with medical certificate. However, approval of leave does not provide relaxation in the university condition of minimum lectures.
- If a student is absent continuously for ten days from a class without sanction of leave, his/her name may be struck off from college rolls. Re-admission may be allowed only on request of parents.
- A fine of Rs.5 /- per lecture will be charged for remaining absent from the class.

Rules for Identity Card & Library

- Students should contact library immediately after admission for identity card.
- It will be necessary for every student to get the identity card issued in the scheduled time period. The students are required to bring their identity cards while in college and present the same, if asked for.
- Library remains open from 9.00am to 4.00pm throughout the session except on Sundays and other holidays.
- Students should deposit their personal belongings at the entrance before entering the library.
- Students are strictly prohibited to take cuttings from library books, newspapers and magazines.
- Books will be issued for 14 days and must be returned and get reissued, if needed. Fine of Re.1 per day will be charged for overdue books.
- Any student, who loses, defaces or otherwise damages any book shall have to pay the cost of the book as per library rules.
- Books should be carefully checked before getting issued.
- Number of books which can be borrowed at a time from library is:
Undergraduate classes: Three books.
Post Graduate classes: Six books.
- Library books should be returned in the library at the end of session for clearance of account.
- Loss of ticket should be reported to the librarian. A fine of Rs10 per ticket will be charged for the loss of ticket. Failure in reporting the loss of ticket, student will have to pay for the books if those are issued on lost tickets.
- Students are expected to maintain discipline and silence in the library and reading hall.
- The loss of identity card should be reported immediately and an FIR should be registered.
- Fine of Rs100 will be charged in case of loss of identity card. It is the responsibility of the student to get duplicate card issued immediately.
- Reference books and magazines will not be issued to the students.
- Text books will be issued for full academic session to the poor and deserving students from book-bank.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

With a view to help the economically weak and meritorious students, the college provides many scholarships and free-ships. These include academic, sports and cultural scholarships. There is a provision of free education to physically challenged students. The financial assistance shall be provided to deserving and eligible students as per College/University/Government rules; the same shall be displayed on the notice board of the college. Those who wish to avail this facility shall have to apply in time as per notice displayed. The list of government scholarships/ fee concessions available is as following:

- Govt. of India/State Govt. Merit Scholarship.
- Scheme of Post Matric Scholarship for students belonging to S.C./S.T., O.B.C and Minorities
- Scheme of merit-cum-means-scholarship for students belonging to the minority communities.
- Any other financial scheme announced by the Govt. will be applicable for college students.
- Fee concession to the wards of university employees shall be given as per ordinances of Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar.

FEE RULES

- University Examination fees will be charged semester wise and as notified by the college from time to time.
- Migration fees will be charged at the time of admission from the concerned students as per university rules.
- Bus fees and Practical fees will be charged from the concerned students only.
- It will be responsibility of the student/parents to deposit the fees in time.
- Late fee fine is decided by the university and dates are notified from time to time.
- Students seeking late admission will not have any concession in late fee.
- Fees once deposited will be refunded under university rules only.
- If a student leaves the college in the middle of the session, he/she is required to inform the college office. Failing this he/she will have to deposit all dues along with fine in order to claim any certificate from the college.
- Half tuition fee will be remitted to the junior most of two or more siblings.
- Students who leave the college can get the refund of their security by 30th November in the following session, subject to the condition that all their dues are cleared. If not claimed in time, security will be lapsed. Students will have to produce original receipt of their fee of entry year in the college to claim the security.
- Financial assistance to Scheduled Caste students will be provided as per Punjab government scheme of Post Matric Scholarship. Scholarship will be paid to the students whose parents/guardians' income from all sources is not more than Rs. 2,50,000/- (Rs. Two lakhs and fifty thousand only) per annum.
- However, an income certificate by the parents/Guardians, stating definite income from all sources from Executive Magistrate is required.
