College Profile

Keeping in view the academic needs of the residents of rural, semi-urban and border areas of Tarn Taran district to impart affordable quality education to spread knowledge, the Higher Education department of the Government of Punjab established this College as Government College, Chungh (Tarn Taran).



The foundation stone of the College was laid on 18th of February, 2010 by the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Punjab, S. Parkash Singh Badal in the presence of the education, Civil Aviation, Vigilance and Law Minister Dr. Upinderjit Kaur; Member of Parliament, S. Ratan Singh Ajnala; M.L.A. Valtoha constituency, S. Virsa Singh Valtoha; Principal Secretary, Higher Education, S. K.B.S Sidhu, IAS and Deputy Commissioner Tarn Taran, Shri Khushi Ram. Later on, the Punjab Government handed over the College to the administration of the University as a Constituent College and the College was renamed as Guru Nanak Dev University College, Chungh (Tarn Taran). Subsequently, the formal inauguration of the college was held on October 21, 2011 by Hon'ble Chief Minister of Punjab, S. Parkash Singh Badal. From its beginning since academic session 2011-12, under the visionary guidance of Worthy Vice-Chancellor, Guru Nanak Dev University, Dean Academic Affairs, Dean College Development Council and under the dynamic leadership of current OSD Mrs. Kinderjit Kaur, the College is consistently endeavouring to achieve the set goals.

Deserted and terrified owing to repeated Indo- Pak wars, devoid of basic infrastructure of education, even after decades of independence, this area was waiting for such a milestone to happen. Dream of development of the people was realized by the Government of Punjab in the form of this very college in the natural and beautiful setting. The college is spread over

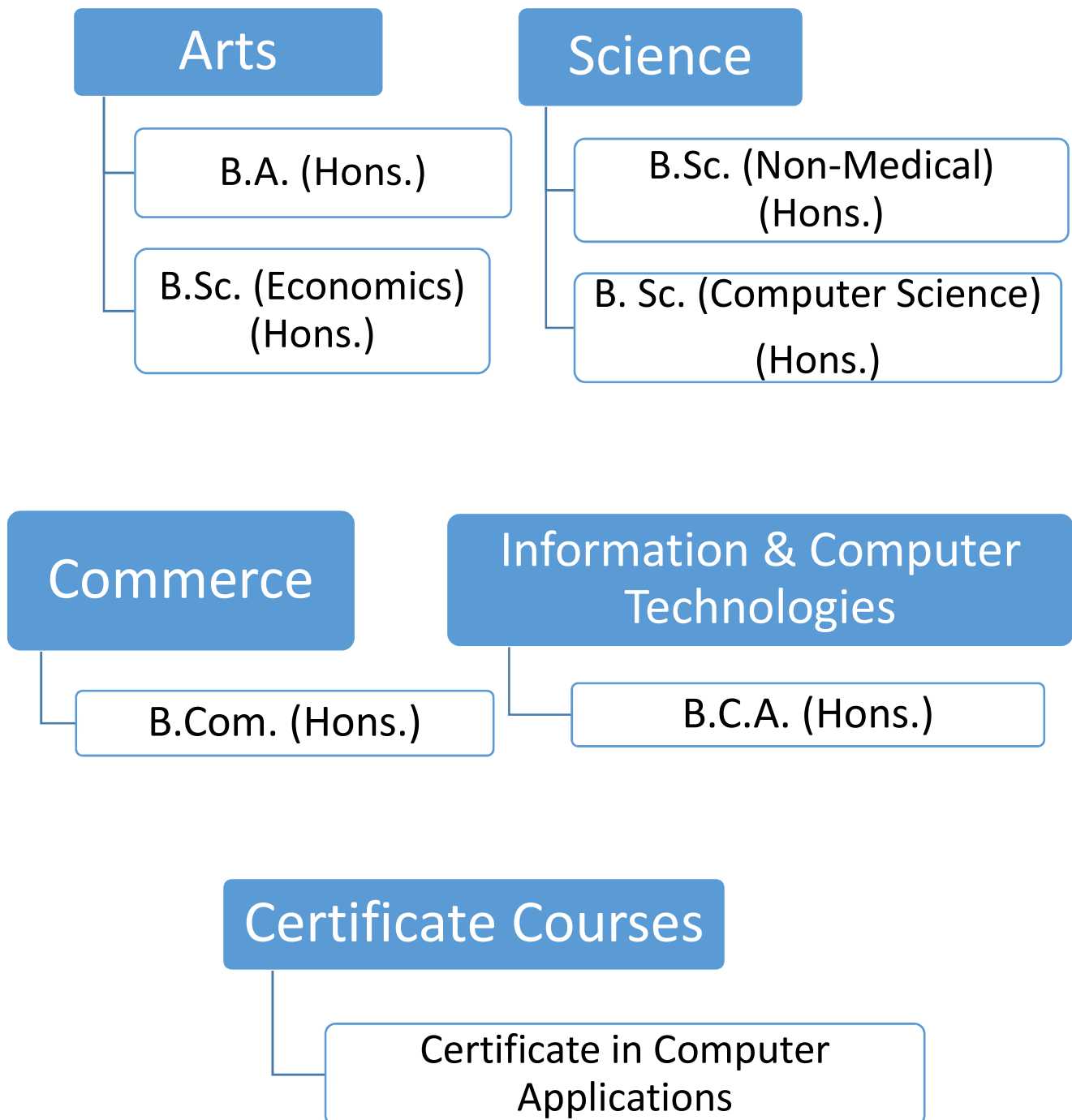

Bachelor's Degree Programmes



4-year UG Honours Degree Programmes under NEP 2020

The Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar has introduced 4-year under graduate Honours Degree Programmes as per NEP 2020 in all the affiliated colleges/ constituent colleges from the academic year 2025-26. The University has developed the curricular framework for Honours programmes incorporating a credit-based grading system, a multidisciplinary approach, with specialization in a single discipline specific course in the 4th year of the program.

This policy mandates compliance with the curricular framework and standard operating procedures outlined herein. Compliance with these procedures is mandatory for all the colleges.

The curriculum framework for 4-year UG Degree Programmes has the following features:

1. Discipline Specific Courses: Discipline Specific Courses (DSC) are designed to provide indepth knowledge and skills pertinent to a particular field or profession. These courses focus on specialized content and methodologies tailored to the needs of students pursuing carrier in that discipline. These courses are integral to build a solid foundation in the respective fields and often involve both theoretical study and practical application through labs, projects, internship etc.

Each student is required to select and successfully complete three DSCs as part of first 3 years of their undergraduate degree program. In the 4th year of undergraduate honours degree programme, students have the option to choose any one of the Discipline Specific Courses (DSC) that they have studied during the first three years of their undergraduate degree programme.

2. Ability Enhancement Courses: Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC) are designed to develop essential skills and competencies that complement the student's major field of study, enhancing their overall educational experience and employability.

Each student is required to successfully complete at least one AEC every year during first three years of undergraduate degree program.

3. Multidisciplinary Courses: Multidisciplinary Courses (MDC) are designed to integrate knowledge and methodologies from multiple disciplines, providing student with a holistic understanding of complex issues and fostering innovation thinking.

Each student is required to select and successfully complete at least one MDC every year during first 3 years of undergraduate degree program.

4.Skill Enhancement Courses: Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) are designed to develop specific skills that are valuable for personal growth, academic excellence, and career readiness.

Each student is required to select and successfully complete at least one SEC every year during first 3 years undergraduate degree program.

5.Value Added Courses: Value Added Courses (VAC) are designed to provide students with specialized knowledge and understanding in critical areas that are relevant to societal and

environmental challenges. Value added courses viz Drug Abuse: problem management and prevention, Environmental Studies and Human Rights & Constitutional Duties are mandatory qualifying courses for a student of an undergraduate degree program. Students are required to successfully complete all the three VACs during first 3 years of undergraduate degree programme.

Standard Operating Procedures

Entry and Exit options for Students of 4-year UG Degree Programme with Honours:

Entry 1: 1st year 1st Sem.):

* The entry requirement for the 1st year of 4-year UG Degree is Intermediate/ 12th class of PSEB/CBSE/ or any other equivalent certificate and as per the eligibility conditions as specified in the Ordinances related to respective stream/ programme.

Entry 2: 4th year (VIIth Sem.):

* A student who has completed a three-year degree program with three discipline specific subjects (majors) may enter in the 4th year (VIIth Sem) of Honours programme in any one of the three discipline specific subjects (major) studied in the first three years of the UG Degree Programme.

Note: Students who complete the first three years in a college shall be automatically promoted to the 4th year within the same college, without any new admissions provided the student must fulfil all eligibility and promotion criteria as stipulated in CBGS Ordinances.

Exit 1: after 3-years (6 sem.):

* Students must pass all courses/papers in Semesters 1 to 6 if they wish to exit after three years with a normal UG

* A Bachelor's Degree is to be awarded if students exit after successful completion of 3-year of study.

Exit 2: after 4-years (8 sem.):

* A Bachelor's Degree with Honours is to be awarded if students exit after successful completion of 4 year of study.

Infrastructure and Learning Resources

Computer Laboratories

In consonance with the challenges of modern era, to make the students computer-literate, the college has well-equipped computer labs. These labs have been provided with state-of-the-art equipments, including internet facilities

Science Laboratories

As the knowledge of scientific principles is the most well received and retained, when imparted through practical demonstrations and empirical investigations; the institute has as many as nine Physics, Chemistry, Geography, Psychology, Commerce and Mathematics labs well equipped with Internet models, slides, charts and different instruments as per academic requirements of the students.

Sports Activities

Physical well-being of an individual, being equally important as mental development, the students are encouraged to participate in a variety of sports. Annual Sports Meet around the end of each academic session are organised. The outstanding students among boys and girls, in different competitions are awarded Prizes and Certificates. 'Best Sportspersons' will be selected amongst girls and boys on the basis of points earned so as to be honoured. Arrangements have been made for Badminton and Volleyball games.



College Council

College Council, an internal policy-making and decision-making body of college, will consist of Principal (Chairperson) and five senior teachers (including Bursar). Administrative, academic and disciplinary decisions of this council are binding on the students

Tutorial Groups

The students of the college are divided into tutorial groups. Each student is included in some tutorial group. The tutor looks after overall development of students in his/ her tutorial group and provides them with the appropriate guidance from time-to-time. Thus, students can meet their group tutors in case of any difficulty. Students are not allowed to change their tutorial group. It is compulsory for all students to attend tutorial meets.

Library and Identity Cards

In order to provide academic assistance and to enhance the all-round knowledge, the college has a state-of-the-art fully computerized library which apart from housing quality books related to different subjects, is a treasure house of encyclopaedias and rare books. The college has a well-furnished spacious reading room where students can read newspapers, magazines, books etc. in a peaceful environment. The college library has an open shelf system that provides free access of books to the students. A Library-cum- Identity Card is issued to every students after admission which must be possessed by him/ her all the time so that it can be produced as a proof of identity whenever required.

First-Aid Cell

The college has a First-aid Cell which provides free medicines to the students in case of sudden illness. This cell also teaches first aid techniques to the students applicable in case of any emergency. The cell inculcates awareness regarding health problems. Lectures by specialist doctors are organized for the purpose.

Extension and Outreach Activities Cell

Extension and Outreach Activities Cell aims at imbuing in the students a sense of participation in Nation building. Emphasis of the cell is on sensitizing the students and general public towards grave menaces like drug addiction, AIDS, illiteracy, gender inequality, female foeticide etc. through seminars, rallies, competitions and awareness campaigns. Justice, liberty, equality and fraternity as enshrined in the Constitution of India are the guiding principles of this cell. Pamphlets about 'Awareness against Drug Addiction', 'AIDS Awareness', 'Diabetes Awareness' are regularly distributed in the area so as to spread awareness among the people. The cell also lays special emphasis on ' Gender Equality by ensuring the participation of girl students in such programmes and activities and also by arranging 'Women Empowerment Week', in collaboration with the Women Cell of the college.

Youth Welfare and Cultural Heritage Club

In order to provide students a constructive channel for the expression of their creative urges; to facilitate their all-round development and to make their leisure time recreational, adventurous and socially beneficial; great emphasis is laid on youth welfare and cultural activities.

This club organizes Talent-Search Competitions for the students and the winners are awarded prizes on the event of Annual Prize Distribution. The club encourages students to participate in Youth Festival organized by university and also in inter-college competitions. Students are trained well to excel in events like Quiz, Poetical Recitation, Photography, Ghazal, Sketching

etc. Keeping in view the fast changing social values, the club organizes special activities in order to preserve our rich cultural heritage

As per instructions of the University, the college has established Parents-Teachers Association so as to promote the association of teachers and parents of students. The main purpose of this association is to work for the betterment and welfare of the students by providing them more and more educational and other facilities. A working committee is constituted from amongst parents, students and teachers. The College Principal is the Patron/ President of this association.

Women Cell/Equal Opportunity Cell

Ours being an educationally backward area, in order to promote constructive thinking in the society, the awareness concerning role of women becomes very important. Realizing the same, the college has established a Women Cell. This cell organizes workshops and other activities from time- to-time to make girls efficient in activities, like painting, pot-making, candle-making etc., so as to make them financially self-reliant. Red Ribbon Club

In order to create awareness about alarmingly spreading deadly disease like AIDS, the college has established Red Ribbon Club. Its members are students and a senior teacher acts as the Project Officer. This club organizes seminars and awareness activities to educate the students and common public.

Scholarship

The college has provision for Post- Matric Scholarships for Minorities, Scheduled Castes and Other Backward Classes by Government of Punjab and is registered online with the concerned department. The students can get themselves registered online from the college in order to avail this facility. It is the responsibility of the student to contact with concerned teacher/college office.

Guidance and Counselling Cell

It is mandatory for every teacher to conform to this division while covering the syllabus. One copy of this calendar is available in the library for consultation by the students.

An annual calendar of the college is also prepared. It contains record of all the proposed month-wise co-curricular activities to be performed in the college. Thus, apart from academic curriculum, extension activities related to each subject are also looked into by each department. To monitor and to keep record of all such activities a core curriculum committee is operational in the college that maintains an intensive record of all the activities.

Prizes & Awards

The college aims at promoting academic excellence and in order to achieve the purpose, the students with higher academic and other skills are awarded prizes:

- 1. University Examination Prizes:** Prizes are awarded on the basis of university examinations amongst college students in their respective classes.
- 2. 100 percent Attendance Award:** 100 percent attendance award / awards will be awarded to the student (s) who attend 100% of the delivered lectures in all the subject during the session. A cash prize of Rs.100 will be given.
- 3. Best Student Award:** The Best Student Award will be awarded to the student performing exceptionally well in the academic as well as cultural activities. However, more weightage will be given to the academic performance.
- 4. Best in Cultural Activities:** Each year, a prize: 'Best in Cultural Activities' will be awarded. This prize will be awarded on the basis of points earned by the student for his/ her cultural performances.

Note: Students with lecture shortage cannot be the claimant of these awards.

Disciplinary action ever taken against the student will also deprive him/her from these awards.
