College Profile



About City Patti

The word Patti is a changed version of the words, 'Patt', 'Patti' and 'Patte'. The word 'Patt' means town, 'Patti' refers to a specific area and the meaning of 'Patte' is an approved piece of writing. In earlier times, these towns or areas were given on lease by the authorities. Therefore, this region eventually became renowned as 'Patti'. Patti has its own distinct history and glory. In Hieun Tsang's voyage to India, as well, Patti finds mention. Hieun Tsang came to India in 629 A.D. This was the reign of Harsh vardhan. It is thus evident that 'Patti' had an established reputation since ancient times. 'Patti' is also famous for the myth of King Duni Chand. It is believed that King Duni Chand in an angry outburst ordered his daughter Bibi Rajni to marry a cripple, a deformed young man. 'Patti' also has an educational institute in Bibi Rajni's name. 'Patti' occupied a prestigious position during the reign of the Mughals too. It has a huge castle. This castle had a stud farm for the superior breed of horses. The castle was initially used as a stable for horses and was maintained by horse riders. It served as a means for administrative control for the Authority. 'Patti' was under the reign of Sardar Khushal Singh when the Sikh military regime existed. He was the nephew of Nawab Kapur Singh. Kapur Singh didn't have his own child. So he made his nephew his successor. Maharaja Ranjit Singh had acquired the possession of 'Patti' from Khushal Singh. 'Patti' was considered the hub (centre) of Majha area. 'Majha' is further the core area in Punjab. It is not only a central area but also the most significant area. Before Partition 'Majha' comprised Lahore in Punjab and the area around Tarn Taran and Amritsar. The 'Tehsil' 'Patti' and Kasoor (the first 'Tehsil' of Pakistani Punjab) was the actual area under 'Majha'. The area was extremely fertile. The land in 'Majha' was known for its fertility. It was renowned for its prosperity. And hence, it had a thick population. During the reign of Maharaja Ranjit Singh, 'Patti' was known as the 'Nau Lakhi Patti' or the 'nine lac Patti' to symbolize its fertility. The maximum tax 9 lac, used to be collected from Patti in Punjab and for that reason the 'Lahorias' or 'Majhails' were greatly renowned. Lahore was also the capital city of Punjab throughout the reign of concerned government/ authorities. Since 'Patti' was located near Lahore, it acquired a significance of its own. 'Patti' thus has its own historical glory. During partition, Majha region also got divided. Due to Indo-Pak wars cities & towns located near newly built border gradually lagged behind in the race of development and became insignificant and Patti is one such town.



About College

With the changing time, the efforts started in the direction of providing higher education to the residents of this region. Consequently, a Government college was started at Patti in 1969. Initially the classes were held in the Government Senior Secondary School, Patti. The construction of building of the college was completed by 1973 and the first batch started in 1973-74. This college is situated on the Patti-Sarhali road. The total area of the college is 28 acres. Out of this, 8 acres has been given to the stadium of the Sports College. The college has an 'H' shaped double storey building. College has a well furnished administrative block, well stacked library with rich collection of books. There is a hostel also along with the college. The motive behind establishing this college was to provide higher education to the students of rural, backward and border region. It provided benefit to the area tremendously in terms of education but it failed to fulfill the needs of changing scenario due to lack of new professional and vocational courses and deficiency of staff. Due to these reasons, students from this region had to move to other cities to acquire higher education. The students and people of this region demanded to upgrade this college as per the needs of the time. This college has come under the management/administration of the University from the session 2012-13 as one of its constituent college. Guru Nanak Dev University has named it Guru Nanak Dev University College, Patti. Under the administration of GNDU, College is achieving its goals & providing quality education to this area.

CERTIFICATES REQUIRED FOR ADMISSION

- Original Certificate/D.M.C. of the lower Examination passed.
- Character Certificate from the head of institution last attended (Original)
- Matric Certificate as proof of Date of Birth.
- Migration Certificate to be produced in case of student coming from University or Board other than Guru Nanak Dev University/Punjab School Education Board & Eligibility Certificate issued by Guru Nanak Dev University.
- Certificate regarding Backward Classes or Schedule Caste, Handicapped or any other Category if applicable.

IMPORTANT INSTRUCTIONS FOR ADMISSION

- Students having compartment shall be admitted in graduate (except BA) and Post-Graduate Courses as per University Rules. Admission to the courses having fixed no. of seats will be held on the basis of merit/Test. Migration is not allowed for professional courses having fixed seats.
- Rights regarding migration are reserved with the Principal.
- Personal presence is compulsory at the time of admission.
- Admission will be cancelled & the fee deposited will not be refunded in case of any wrong/false information provided by the candidate.
- It is obligatory for all students to obey college rules & regulations.
- All students must keep their identity cards with them and present them for inspection when

asked to do so by a teacher or competent college authority.

- The right to admission is reserved with the Principal.
 - The principal has the right to refuse the admission to any student.
 - The fee will not be refunded in case the University or the Institutions concerned cancel the student's admission.
 - Eligibility Certificate from Guru Nanak Dev University will have to be produced by those students who have passed their lower examination from a University or Board outside Punjab.
 - Admission will be cancelled in case the fee is not deposited on time or by the date fixed.
- Information & rules and regulations given in this Prospectus can be changed at any time.
The candidate will not be allowed to sit in the University Examination in case his/her lectures are short or he/she does not get the required pass percentage in the House Test.
Any kind of Political Activity is prohibited in the college.

ELIGIBILITY FOR UNIVERSITY EXAMINATION

- Students must attend not less than 75% of the lectures delivered to the class in each of the subject offered and 75% of the periods assigned to practical work in each science subject and subjects having practical.
- The students must bear good moral character and his/her work must be satisfactory.
- He/she must obtain at least 35% marks in each individual subject or 25% marks in aggregate of all the subjects in the house examination.

OR

- 30% marks in aggregate in all subjects in the house examination which the principal of the College may hold at his discretion.
- Only that candidate can take admission in Semester-VI who has cleared his/her Semester-I completely.

CARE OF PROPERTY

- Students of the college should look upon the college property, building, laboratories, buses, apparatus and classrooms as their special pride and refrain from any action that would damage them. Offenders in this regard shall be severely dealt with by the college authorities.
- Students who inadvertently cause any damage to college property are expected to report to the Principal immediately as to what happened. This practice in honesty will stand them in good stead in their later life.
- Students should respect the belongings of their fellow students. If they discover any lost or forgotten articles, they should deliver them immediately to the college office. The office will put up a notice regarding all lost articles instructing the owner to collect it as soon as possible. Students who are found in unlawful possession of another student's property are liable to expulsion from the college.

RULES REGARDING DISCIPLINE

- Each and every student must obey the rules set by the College.
- In the event of indiscipline or misbehaviour, a candidate shall be heavily penalised or can be expelled from the College.
- A Committee of teachers regularly supervises discipline matters in the college.
- The discipline committee after investigating a case of indiscipline or misbehaviour shall penalise the student concerned.
- Wearing gaudy or improper dress is not allowed in the college.
- Boys are not allowed to wear chains, lockets and earrings etc.
- Mobile phones are strictly prohibited in class rooms and in the internal campus of the college.

RULES REGARDING FINE

- Fine shall be imposed on the students who remain absent from the class @ Rs.1/- per period.
- Special fine shall be charged from the students who miss any Seminar / Guest Lecture/Class Test etc.
- Books are to be returned within a fortnight from the date of issue. A late fine of Rs. 1/- shall be charged per day for each book retained beyond the prescribed time.

RULES REGARDING LEAVE

- Application for leave should be signed by father/mother or guardian of the student.
- Leave up to three days can be granted by the college co-ordinator and beyond that it will be granted by the Principal only.
- Indefinite leave can not be granted.
- Sick leave should be supported with a certificate by a registered medical practitioner.
- In case of accident or sickness, the application for leave should be forwarded to the Principal as early as possible.
- Students remaining continuously absent for more than 14 days will be struck off from the college.

INFRASTRUCTURE

Library

The college has a computerized library with was collection of important text books on all subjects and subscribes to literary magazines, magazines on current affairs newspapers etc and we feel proud that our college library has a number of rare books on all subjects. A committee has also been formed to supervise the functioning of the library. For each course Reference Books are available and for different courses about 10,000 books, magazines and journals are also available in the library.

Library Rules Briefly Given Below:

- Reference Books, Newspapers, Magazines and reserved Books shall not be issued to the Students.
- Only two books can be issued to students at a time and for 15 days only.
- Keeping books for more than 15 days entails fine of Rs. 1/- per day per volume.
- The Librarian can recall a book from a student at any time.
- If a book is damaged or lost by a student, he or she will have to pay twice the price of the book. If the book is a part of a set of volumes & is not available separately, the price of the whole set will have to be paid.
- No book shall be issued without Identity card.
- Library books, magazines etc. should not be marked or torn in any way.
- Necessary rules regarding the library are given in the identity card.
- College also has facility of Book Bank for the students. Students and teachers have donated books to the book bank which are consulted by the needy students.

Computer Lab

Guru Nanak Dev University College, Patti has introduced a variety of courses namely B.sc (C.sc), BCA, PGDCA, DCA, M.sc (C.sc). For this purpose college has fully air conditioned lab in which more 20 computers with internet facility are installed. Special attention is given to impart practical knowledge to the students.

Science Labs

As the knowledge of Scientific principles is the most well received and retained ,when imparted through practical demonstration and empirical investigations; The College has Physics, Chemistry, Biology and Vocational (RAC &Automobile) Labs well equipped with models, slides, charts, instruments, apparatus, samples and chemicals as per academic requirement of the students.

For financial assistance at institutional level, every year applications for financial assistance are invited. Needy and deserving students are identified on the basis of the annual income of their parents.

- Each One Educate One, a philanthropic organization, also sponsors the needy students.
- The students who are given financial aid are expected to maintain high academic standard to receive further grants.

STUDENT SUPPORTIVE SERVICES

Grievance Redressal Cell

As per the instructions of U.G.C, the college has established grievance redressal committee. This committee looks into the grievances of the students as well as the staff and takes measures to redress them suitably.

Anti-Sexual Harassment Committee

This Anti-Sexual Harassment Committee has been established in the college as per the notification released by Ministry of Human Resource Development (UGC) in May, 2016 under the commission of Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal of Sexual Harassment of women employees and students in Higher Education Institutions) Regulation, 2015. Its objective are to facilitate a safe environment that is free from harassment and to promote behaviors that creates an atmosphere to ensure gender equality and equal opportunities. It takes cognizance of complaints about sexual conduct enquiries, provide assistance and reduce victims, recommend penalties and take action against harasser, if necessary.

Anti-ragging Committee

This committee is constituted to check the menace of ragging. An undertaking will be taken at the time of admission from every student that he/she will not involve himself/herself in ragging. If a student gives a false undertaking he/she will be expelled from the college. The committee will recommend to the principal to register FIR's against students involved in ragging.

FUNCTIONAL COMMITTEES

Youth Welfare & Cultural Activities

An important goal of education is to make students aware of their cultural heritage. Keeping this objective in mind many cultural activities are arranged in the college, so that students should take part in other fields of life besides their text books. Lectures, variety program including

plays, songs and cultural items are arranged from time to time. Our students have taken part in competition of singing, dancing, speech competition, poem recitation, quiz competition and mime presentation etc. These co-curricular activities not only ensure all-round development of the personality of students but also create a pleasant atmosphere in the campus.

Guidance cum Placement cell

The Guidance cum Placement cell has been working for the benefit of students. Its chief aim is to orient and guide the student regarding their carrier prospects. Full information is provided regarding employment opportunities and selection of courses /subjects through this cell. Besides students of college old students and the people of the area can also receive information or help from the cell. The cell arranges orientation camps to acquaint the students with the various courses and placement opportunities available.

Information Officer

In compliance with the right to information Act 2005 for bringing transparency, openness and accountability in the affairs, the college has deputed a Professor as Information officer to provide enquired information.

NCC (National Cadet Corps)

NCC place significant role in shaping the life carrier of our youth. It includes discipline, punctuality, partriosm and team spirit among is cadets and motivates them to join armed forces. The college has Army Wing 24 Punjab Battalion in which both boys and girls can enroll. The enrollment process starts at the beginning of the college session July every year.

N.S.S. (National Service Scheme)

The N.S.S. Unit of college encourages the students to participate in community development programmes and social service. The student can get themselves enrolled for community services under NSS programme. A special camp is organized every year. The Unit also organizes social activities to make them aware of social problems and of their roles and responsibilities. At present, there is one NSS unit with more than 50 volunteers enroll. The NSS unit of the college has adopted Bathe –Bhaini village for undertaking social related activities.

Red Ribbon Club

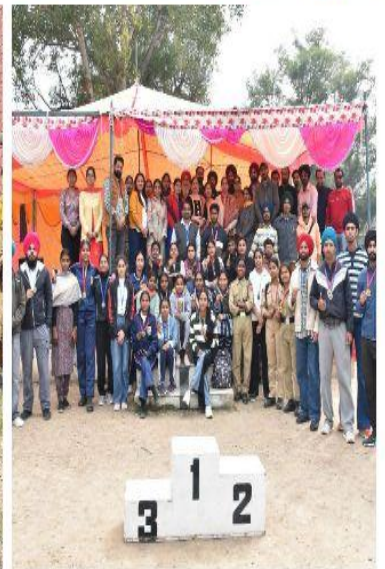

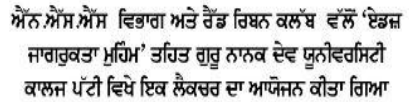
